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## CARES Act Coronavirus Relief Grants

**Total Amount: \$150 Billion**

### Description

- Enacted in P.L. 116-136 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act on March 27, 2020.
- Provides \$150 billion in direct assistance to states (\$139 billion), territories including the District of Columbia (\$3 billion), and tribal governments (\$8 billion) for spending related to the pandemic.
- Allocation is based on state or territory population. Each state's allocation must be a minimum of \$1.25 billion. For tribal governments, allocation is based on its share of aggregate tribal expenditures in fiscal year 2019.

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## Families First Coronavirus Response Act UI Emergency Administrative Grants

**Total Amount: \$1 Billion**

### Description

- Enacted in P.L. 116-127 Families First Coronavirus Response Act on March 18, 2020.
- Provides \$1 billion in grants to states and the territories for administration of unemployment insurance (UI) programs.
- Each state's allocation is calculated by multiplying its proportionate share of taxable wages, under the Federal Unemployment Tax Act, by \$1 billion.

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## Families First Coronavirus Response Act Enhanced Medicaid FMAP

**Total Amount: \$50.2 Billion**

### Description

- Enacted in P.L. 116-127 Families First Coronavirus Response Act on March 18, 2020.
- Provides all states and territories with a temporary and retroactive (January 1, 2020) 6.2 percentage-point increase in Medicaid's Federal Medical Assistance Percentages (FMAP). The FMAP increase will occur until the last day of the calendar quarter in which the public health emergency is declared.
- The enhanced FMAP rates are estimated to result in an additional \$50 billion to states and \$204 million to territories, including the District of Columbia, in pandemic-related Medicaid funding. The distribution of additional Medicaid funds by state and territory is dependent on total medical expenses (which vary due to myriad factors including severity of pandemic) and is currently not available.

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## CARES Act Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund

**Total Amount: \$13.2 Billion**

### Description

- Enacted in P.L. 116-136 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act on March 27, 2020.
- Provides \$13.2 billion in direct assistance to states, including the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico, for spending on K-12 education-related activities due to the pandemic.
- Allocation is determined by factors such as the population of poverty-stricken children and the state's per-pupil spending on education.

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## CARES Act Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund

**Total Amount: \$2.95 Billion**

### Description

- Enacted in P.L. 116-136 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act on March 27, 2020.
- Provides \$2.95 billion in direct assistance to states, including the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico, to support K-12, higher education, and other education entities that have been affected by the pandemic.
- Allocation is based on each state's population of 5- to 24-year olds and the number of children counted under Section 1124(c) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, which takes into account age and poverty status among other factors.

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## CARES Act FEMA Disaster Relief Fund

**Total Amount: \$45 Billion**

### Description

- Enacted in P.L. 116-136 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act on March 27, 2020.
- \$45 Billion in the CARES Act was designated for the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Disaster Relief Fund (DRF). DRF funding is for response and recovery efforts to assist states and territories during major disasters and emergencies. According to currently available data (as of March 31, 2020), approximately \$3 billion in funding had been distributed.
- FEMA has the discretion to allocate funds to meet the highest priorities across the nation. Each month, the FEMA Administrator will provide Congress with allocation distribution updates.

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## CARES Act FTA Transit Infrastructure Grants

**Total Amount: \$25 Billion**

### Description

- Enacted in P.L. 116-136 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act on March 27, 2020.
- Provides \$25 billion in funds for Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Transit Infrastructure Grants to urban communities (\$22.7 billion) and rural areas (\$2.2 billion). Operating expenses and administrative leave are eligible for funding.
- Allocation is formula-based and considers factors such as population size and the amount of service provided.

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## CARES Act Airport Improvement Program

**Total Amount: \$10 Billion**

### Description

- Enacted in P.L. 116-136 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act on March 27, 2020.
- Provides \$10 billion in economic relief to the nation's airports that have been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. According to currently available data (as of April 15, 2020), approximately \$9 billion in funding had been distributed.
- Allocation is formula-based and considers factors such as the number of annual passengers, airport debt level, and airport category.

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## CARES Act Community Development Block Grant Program

**Total Amount: \$5 Billion**

### Description

- Enacted in P.L. 116-136 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act on March 27, 2020.
- Provides \$5 billion in flexible Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding to state and local governments to address various community needs related to the pandemic. According to currently available data (as of April 17, 2020), approximately \$2 billion in grants had been distributed.
- Allocation is formula-based: approximately 70 percent of CDBG funding will be allocated to eligible local governments and the remaining 30 percent will be allocated to states for disbursement in non-entitled areas. U.S. territories are included.

## CARES Act Homeless Assistance Emergency Solutions Grants

**Total Amount: \$4 Billion**

### Description

- Enacted in P.L. 116-136 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act on March 27, 2020.
- Provides \$4 billion in supplemental funding to states and territories, including the District of Columbia, for homeless assistance grants. According to currently available data (as of April 17, 2020), approximately \$1 billion in grants had been distributed.
- Allocation is based on the current Emergency Solutions Grants formula, in addition to a formula determined by the Department of Housing and Urban Development Secretary which considers factors such as the risk of coronavirus spread, housing market conditions, and an area's homeless population.

## CARES Act Child Care and Development Block Grant

**Total Amount: \$3.5 Billion**

### Description

- Enacted in P.L. 116-136 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act on March 27, 2020.
- Provides \$3.5 billion in supplemental funding to states (\$3.3 billion), territories including the District of Columbia (\$54.6 million), and tribal governments (\$96.3 million) for child care assistance related to the pandemic.
- Allocation is based on the current formula for the Child Care and Development Block Grant, which considers factors such as a state's population of children under the age of five, number of children receiving free or reduced-price school lunches, and the per capita income for each state.
